



Announcing a new way to honor  
departed AAPA members.



At the 2009 executive committee meeting, the AAPA executive board decided that recently deceased AAPA members could be honored by dedicating a contributed session in their name.

**Who can be honored?** Anyone who passed away from 2008 through November 2009, at which point the program goes to print.

**How do I nominate someone to be honored?** Please send an e-mail to: Lorena Madrigal, VP and program Chair at [madrigal@cas.usf.edu](mailto:madrigal@cas.usf.edu). In your e-mail, please send the name of the person you want to honor, as well as the area in biological anthropology (primatology, genetics, etc.) of the desired session. You can expect an e-mail from the program Chair within 48 hours responding to your message. If you do not receive such an e-mail, please contact her again at 813 974-0817 (probably your e-mail was filtered).

**What will the program issue say?** We will note that a particular session is dedicated to the memory of the departed member. We do not make any promises as to the contents of the session itself, and cannot guarantee that the person who is being honored would have agreed with the papers presented in the session. Due to the costs associated with the printing of the program, we will not print the names of the persons who put forth the nomination, as they may be several. However, we encourage nominators to volunteer to be Chairs of sessions. If possible, we will assign the nominator to Chair the session in honor of the departed member. All decisions regarding the session assigned to honor the departed member will be taken by the program Chair.
